

# St. Mary Magdalene, Ickleton, Cambs.

Late Saxo-Romanesque arcaded nave; possible 'matching' date of tower with its lightly incised mouldings with flat abaci of the cushion capitals. Original clerestory now below later clerestory (when roof raised). Reuse of Roman pillars (the slimmer are Roman, and alternate with custom made work). *All pages, pictures viewed clockwise starting top left.*
