1. The church from the NW.
2. Chancel arch from the nave.
3. Nave, and chancel beyond, the random stone blocks of the walling seen from the NW.
4. The N doorway to nave.
5. South capital, chancel arch, seen from the west (& see pic 7), scrolls and monsters.
6. North capital, chancel arch - both Saxon and Roman, the impost is a reused Roman fragment, obvious in its (truncated) classical section (see Taylor & Taylor).
7. South capital seen again here, strange in its 'tiered' top heavy effect, it is actually deeper in height than its sister.
